

Miracles in Texas

Good news is like water to a thirsty soul. That's what **Proverbs 25:25** says. For years these gentle saints have been faithfully standing for the lives of little boys and girls at the Dallas North Park abortion mill on Meadow Road in Dallas. They are now drinking deeply of the blessed news that this killing center is shut down at long last.

The first word that this mill was on the verge of shutting down came from a patient on Friday, November 1, 2013. She stopped on her way out of the mill to receive some pro-life literature and told us she had no insurance and was seeking a pap smear – not an abortion. She was told by the North park staff that they were closing. A caller was also told by a staff member that they were no longer doing abortions, they were closing.

Saturday, November 2, 2013, the gates were shut tighter than a drum and have remained so!

Dallas had 14 abortion mills operating in the city when we began, in 1988, to bring the Gospel of Christ to these “*gates of hell.*” Today, there are four abortion mills left in the city. Now Dallas, along with other Texas cities, is being impacted by a new law requiring those who kill children to have admitting privileges at a local hospital.



This sounds the death knell for most abortionists in Texas because most are not fit to do surgery in a veterinary clinic.

Another Dallas mill, *Abortion Advantage* (abortionist Robinson's mill), has been forced to shut down until January. Speculation is that they are seeking someone who has hospital privileges to kill children or are hoping for a reversal when the full court hearing on the law, which was challenged by the ACLU, Planned Parenthood, and other pro-abortion groups takes place in January.

So, at this moment in time, Dallas is down to three mills ... praise the Lord! Unfortunately, one of the three remaining abortion mills, *Routh Street*, saw forty-four patients in during a 2 ½ hour span on Friday, November 8. They're catching the run-off from closed Dallas mills plus Fort Worth whose three abortuaries have been closed because of the same law that shut down the mills in Dallas.

We are wondering how long the 80 year old owner of *Routh Street* can keep up with his killing schedule because he is one of the few abortionists in Dallas that still has hospital privileges. He had given up actually doing abortions until last week when the hospital privileges law took effect.

From what we can determine, across the state of Texas there are 17 abortion mills that have had to close their doors in the past couple of weeks. You can be sure that there will be more closures during the month of December. We're praying for and will continue working toward the day when no child dies through abortion in the state of Texas.
